The incident has been reported to the police who are investigating the matter. All staff are aware of the issue and in line with our safeguarding procedures, have spoken to the children in their classes. Mr Heaton, Miss Robinson and our Safeguarding Lead Mr Leach have also spoken to the children in assemblies today about 'stranger danger'. We will also have a large staff presence outside after-school. It would be helpful if you would reinforce the 'stranger danger' message at home too. Thank you for your continued support.
