Our whole-school curriculum theme for this week was: 'Sex and Relationships Education' as part of our focus on the core value of 'Safety' this half-term. The children in Years 1-6 followed a scheme of work (The Christopher Winters Project). # **Year 4 Visit to Chester as part of their History Topic**

On Monday 18th June, Year 4 travelled 2000 years back in time to a period when the Romans ruled over Europe. Pupils and staff visited the 'Dewa Roman Experience in Chester' and found out some fascinating things about the Romans. The children were given the opportunity to experience the sights, sounds and smells of Roman Britain as well as trying on Roman armour. The children then descended three metres below the earth's surface in order to see and touch the Roman walls that were built 2000 years ago. The children had a fantastic day with one child commenting: "I had so much fun and I would like to go back with my mum and dad!"

To start their new science topic on plants, Year 3 spent the day out at Ness Botanic Gardens on the Wirral, where they discovered and learnt about a variety of plants from around the world.
