Every year group from Reception to Year 6 took part enthusiastically. There were so many to choose from: classic fairy tales to favourite characters like Peppa Pig and Thomas the Tank Engine. The children loved exploring the books from their favourite authors. One boy managed to grab himself a David Walliams classic. He was so excited, he commented: "I just can't wait to get home and start reading it. The book swap was a great idea. I hope we celebrate International Book Giving Day every year". Also, this week Renaissance Learning did a school feature on Florence Melly Community Primary School at a book launch with authors in London at Sadler's Wells Theatre on "What kids are reading". They included a quote from a Year 6 pupil, who said: "I love that reading can transport you into a different world".

Tree Planting in Walton Hall Park

What a fantastic morning our children had planting trees in Walton Hall Park. 30 pupils teamed up with the 'Friends of Walton Hall Park' and the 'Mersey Forest Association' to plant trees in our local park as part of a scheme to plant 1000 trees this week with the help of local schools. The Mersey Forest is a growing network of woodlands being created across Merseyside and North Cheshire to benefit people, wildlife and the economy. The children learned specific planting skills including: the best areas to dig, linear planting and safety when using spades. The 'Friends of Walton Hall Park' were on hand to support children with their planting as well as educating staff and students on how to keep the park clean and safe. The pupils thoroughly enjoyed the experience with one child commenting: "This morning was great and it was fun helping the park and protecting wildlife. I know that in a couple of years our trees will help protect squirrels, hedgehogs and birds with their habitats".



What a fantastic first day back our pupils have had today. The LFC Foundation brought in the European Cup for a fantastic KS2 assembly. The assembly was delivered in partnership with the Premier League Stars campaign and the focus was on diversity, which has featured as a whole-school theme recently. It was an amazing morning back into school after half term and the children even got to meet Mighty Red!
