#### **Enrichment Visit to Princes Road Synagogue**

Earlier this week, some of our Year 4 pupils visited the Princes Road Synagogue in Toxteth as part of last week's whole-school theme: World Religions. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring the first Grade I listed synagogue outside London. The children gained first hand experiences of the Liverpool Old Hebrew Congregation. The Orthodox Jewish community, which is set in the heart of Liverpool, is steeped in tradition and Victorian elegance. Our pupils were treated to a tour of the synagogue and experienced the magnificent interior, laid out like a gothic basilica and were enthralled with the exhibition in the synagogue annexe charting the 230-year history of the congregation and the wider Liverpool community. What a memorable way to experience world religion week!
