DAILY LITERACY ACTIVITIES

Hook for a book!

What has happened in our nursery? Who has been here? When did they come here? Why do you think they have been here? How did they get here?



Challenge

Can you record what you think has happened and your idea for the reason why it has happened?

DAILY MATHS ACTIVITIES

Collecting circles

Find objects around your homes that are **circles**. Draw around the circular objects then cut them out to produce 'circles.' Use your 'cut out circles' to make your very own 'circle' picture.



Challenge

Talk with your adult what a circle shape looks like i.e. it is round, curved, no sharp points etc. How many circular objects have you collected altogether? Are your circles all the same size?

THE WIDER CURRICULUM

Messy Monday

Let's crack an egg! Have fun exploring cracking eggs in to a bowl. Feel their texture and talk about how they feel. i.e. slimy, gooey, hard, soft etc. What colours can you see? Can you find the yolk, the shell, the white of the egg? What food can you make using eggs?



Challenge

What is the shell for around an egg? We know from our story that hens lay eggs. What other animals lay eggs? Do all eggs look the same? Find actual eggs or look at photographs of eggs on the internet and talk about how they look. Do they look the same as each other or do all eggs look different?
