



The arrangements for the funeral of Charlie Lowe

Following discussions with Charlie's mum, I am now able to share with parents/carers the arrangements for the funeral of Charlie Lowe. I have taken the decision to close Florence Melly Community Primary School on Friday 26th May 2023, as a mark of respect for our Charlie.

How my staff team have supported your children over the last four weeks, whilst dealing with their own emotions and the sad loss of Charlie, has been nothing short of incredible. It is now time that I support them and give them the opportunity to say goodbye to a wonderful boy. We can only do that by closing the school and I do so with the full support of the Governing Body, the Local Authority and hopefully, yourselves.

There will be a short service for Charlie, held at St Aidan's Church at 10:00am on Friday 26th May, followed by a burial service at Anfield Cemetery. Mum has asked us to inform you that all members of our school community are welcome to attend church; however, we ask that you allow the family to lay Charlie to rest, privately, at the cemetery. Some of you may wish to pay your respects in your own way and not attend.

Next Friday is a day to celebrate the life of Charlie Lowe, a beautiful boy, with a zest for life and a love for football and running. We encourage you all to remember Charlie on this day, whether that be by attending his service or spending time with your family and loved ones.

We would not have got through the last four weeks without your unwavering love and support. The whole community have thrown their arms around our Flo Melly family, and for that, I am forever grateful.
