




WATER SAFETY WITH THE RNLI

Complete School Closure for Election Day - Thursday 4th July 2024

Earlier this week, I wrote to all EYFS parents/carers to let them know of our decision to close our Nursery, Reception and Nest classes due to the General Election. After much deliberation with the Governing Body, the Local Authority and other local Headteachers - we have decided to close the whole-school for the General Election on Thursday 4th July 2024.

This has been a very difficult decision to make and not one that has been taken lightly. After completing a comprehensive risk assessment, we have come to the conclusion that we cannot guarantee the safety of the children - which is absolutely our number one priority! Thousands of members of the public will access our school site on that day and there are too many unknowns to be able to safely coordinate the day with the children on site. Many other local schools, that are also polling stations, have come to the same conclusion and will be closing like ourselves.
