When new boy Albie arrives to live on the island, Tilda wants to show him the secret places and the seals and puffins. But he's not interested. So she promises to take him to a forbidden, haunted island. Together, they make a dangerous trip over the sea – and delve into the past. Beautifully written, this story is about family and belonging and community. It explores how you can feel lonely as a newcomer in a place with friendship networks already established and how tough it is to accept that some things change, even when you don't want them to. There's a gentle message of acceptance, demonstrating that it's worth actually listening to friends and family members when they try to tell you how they're feeling even when you can't always make people do what you want them to do.
