Early Learning Goals

Being Imaginative

Invent, adapt and recount narratives and stories with peers and their teacher.

Sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs.

Perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others, and – when appropriate – try to move in time with music.

Key Vocabulary to be developed in EYFS

Using voices

voice, song, sing, sound, action, up, down, shape (of song), tune, match, pitch, melody, in tune, solo, compose

Playing instruments

loud, quiet, bang, tap, shake, softly, beater, stick, blow, speed, beat, rhythm, in time, volume, tempo

Listening with concentration

sound, music, listen, hear (and simple words to describe sounds: bang, tap, shake, loud, quiet)

repeat, join in, together, phrase, perform, action songs, rhythm, respond, opinion

Experimenting with sounds

shake, tap, ring, bang, explore, body parts, instruments, create, experiment, repeated rhythm, share, group, solo, explain

Examples of how this is achieved in Nursery

Sing and remember entire songs including those linked to routines, topics and celebrations.

Sing and enjoy a variety of nursery rhymes.

Explore a variety of instruments including those they make themselves.

Experiment with their own voices and the sounds they can make with different parts of their bodies.

Examples of how this is achieved in Reception

Build an increasing repertoire of songs, nursery rhymes including those that they make up themselves.

Share a wide range of music from different genres, celebrating different cultures and

Explore local musicians and music, linked to whole-school topics such as 'My Liverpool Home' - The Beatles for example.

Exploring different pieces of music and using musical instruments.

Music KS1 National Curriculum

Pupils should be taught to:

- use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes.
- play tuned and untuned instruments musically.
- listen with concentration and understanding to a range of highquality live and recorded music.
- experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the interrelated dimensions of music.
