Hold an annual high-profile Sports Day at a local athletics track and invite parents/carers to the event.	Using the key learning from last year's successful event, plan another whole-school sports day at Wavertree Athletics Track this year and subsequent years.
To raise the profile of PE and sport across the school, organise further whole-school events, including inter and intra competitions throughout the 2024/25 academic year.	Identify the sporting disciplines to be celebrated and arrange, with the support of our Phase Leaders, inter and intra school competitions.
	Ambassador roles created and pupils actively engaging and promoting PE and Sport at our school.

	Collecting pupils voice, through vigorous monitoring, indicates that pupils' attitudes to PE and Sport have improved.
New play leaders in post, resulting in better lunchtime activities on offer for the children, higher levels of engagement and a higher percentage of pupils involved in moderate to vigorous intensity physical activity on the playground.	Pupil voice recognises the impact of the new resources and approaches at play time and as a result, more pupils engage in regular physical activity.
Stakeholder feedback remains extremely positive around the school's approach to sports day. This results in more children wanting to engage in athletics out of school, joining clubs and participating in other opportunities beyond the classroom. It is the school's intention to hold our sports day at an athletics track every year, building on the successes each time.
