




End of the Week Update for Parents/Carers - Thursday 22nd May 2025

This week's 'Spotlight on Curriculum' takes us to... Nursery and their work to develop pupils' cultural capital!

This week, Nursery have had an amazing time reading the book 'Tilda Tries Again' by Tom Percival. The children thoroughly enjoyed the empowering story, which focused on being resilient and believing in themselves. They also learnt about the importance of helping others, being a good friend and how to make others feel better through kindness. Additionally, they explored how their actions can have a huge impact on someone else's feelings and how it can create a caring environment. It has been a wonderful week full of valuable lessons about resilience, empathy, and kindness.























CT TO REGISTER:

After the half-term, as part of our Cultural Capital curriculum, the children will be exploring...

- Empowerment, as this is our Core Value theme for this half-term.
- Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds as our Relationships and Health Education theme. This topic explores how to stay healthy, both physically and mentally. It explores ways to maintain wellbeing and prevent illness; how to develop a healthy, balanced lifestyle; and the consequences and effects of different habits and choices. It encourages the development of positive self-worth and recognition, what might affect or influence unhealthy ways of thinking, and how to overcome this.

- Liverpool's Good Flood Plan in Year 6 by participating in an exciting cookery and nutrition lesson. The children will look at the five goals of the plan, exploring what good food looks like to them and what they think of the food spaces within school and the wider community.

Wake Up Wednesday - What Parents & Educators Need to Know about Violent Content Online

This free guide explores the troubling rise in children's exposure to violent online content, unpacking the emotional, behavioural and social risks - and how trusted adults can help. With around 70% of teens reporting they've seen violent real-life content on social media in the past year, this guide shines a light on a disturbing - and increasingly common - aspect of young people's digital lives. From shocking videos to hate speech, many children don't go looking for this material, it finds them via algorithms or peer sharing. The guide outlines key concerns, including the mental toll of repeated exposure, shifts in behaviour, and the worrying normalisation of harmful ideologies. It also explains how such content can escalate from screen to street, and why some young people may feel pressured to share or even create violent media themselves: What Parents & Educators Need to Know about Violent Content Online.


