

Bring Art and Design Alive - Sculpture in Year 3!

Mrs Doyle, our Art and Design Lead, has worked tirelessly to design a vibrant and exciting curriculum for the children to enjoy. Earlier this week, pupils in Year 3 had a fantastic afternoon practising their clay modelling skills using techniques such as cross hatching, pinching and rolling! They used their hands and modelling tools to create Salvador Dalí inspired sculptures, the artist they have been exploring!

Enrichment Trip to the NSPCC Headquarters - Speak Out, Stay Safe!

Mr Doyle delivered some very important online safety workshops in Year 6 this week, in collaboration with our friends at the MISPCC. The children have been exploring the Speak Out, Stay Safe initiative. This helps children understand abuse in all its forms and how to recognise the signs of abuse. They learn that abuse is never a child's fault and they have the right to be safe. The children are signposted to where to get help and the sources available to them. The project culminated in a face to face workshop at the NSPCC Headquarters, to follow up the virtual assembly! End of the Week Update for Parents/Carers - Friday 6th June 2025

This week's 'Spotlight on Curriculum' takes us to... Year 1 and their Art and Design topic inspired by Anni Albers!

This week in Year 1, the children eagerly began their new topic, 'Weave Away,' exploring the inspiring work of artist Anni Albers. They were excited to learn about her innovative textile designs and her use of weaving as an art form. The children looked closely at her vibrant, intricate patterns as well as African textiles. Inspired by her creations, they then experimented with their own weaving, using colourful materials to craft their masterpieces. The lesson was filled with enthusiasm and creativity as the children discovered new techniques and expressed their ideas through their woven art pieces.
