

This Week's Book Recommendation...

This week's book recommendation is <u>The Blockbusters by Frank Cottrell-Boyce</u>. When Rafa starts a new school, they embark on a trip to the new Shakespeare theatre, but when they arrive, it's closed for the filming of a blockbuster movie featuring BB, a famous child star! Outraged at being turned away, they sneak on set as extras. Rafa bears an uncanny resemblance to BB, and when her body double doesn't turn up, he steps in to help. After a fun-filled day of filming, the children return home, but Rafa is dismayed to discover that he's accidentally swapped phones with BB. He must get his back, as it's his only means of communication with his big brother, who has mysteriously disappeared. The friends embark on an extraordinary quest to find Rafa's phone, which culminates in a trip to Hollywood aboard a swanky private jet. Frank Cottrell-Boyce skilfully blends an imaginative plot with heartfelt themes of hardship, family bonds and friendship. Bursting with humour this is a compelling read for KS2 pupils.


