#### This Week's Book Recommendation...

This week's book recommendation, complementing our teaching on Remembrance, is War Dog by Tom Palmer. Tom tells the true story of Judy, a canine hero of WWII. Celebrating the courage, loyalty and intelligence of animals who worked alongside service men and women, 'War Dog' is a deeply poignant account of Judy's life as she served on HMS Grasshopper and then was incarcerated as a prisoner of war, sharing the hardships of the crew and bringing them comfort and hope. Forming a special bond with Frank, one of the crew, her devotion to him speaks volumes about the vital role pets play in keeping people happy and healthy - even in the worst circumstances. Written for a younger audience, the story does not shy away from the fact that Judy was badly treated and that the conditions the prisoners were kept in were harsh and frightening but presents this in an age-appropriate manner.

#### This week's spotlight takes us to Year 6 and their reading curriculum...

Year 6 have been making fantastic progress in their reading sessions and are thoroughly enjoying their current class book, Rooftoppers by Katherine Rundell. Alongside reading, they have been exploring new and exciting vocabulary from the text, using it to enhance their understanding and discussion of the story. The children are fully engaged, sharing thoughtful ideas and predictions about the characters and events. It has been wonderful to see their confidence grow and their love of reading flourish. #### Next Week, as part of our Cultural Capital curriculum, the children will be exploring...

- Remembrance during their weekly 'Cultural Capital' lesson and using the picture book 'Bertie's Poppy: A Remembrance Day Story by Inez Bunclark' in order to immerse them in the theme.
- They will also participate in an assembly led by Mr Derbyshire, reminding them about our expectations for behaviour in class!
- Year 2 will participate in an exciting cookery lesson, delivered by our friends at Apple of my Eye, around the theme of Liverpool's Food Heritage and cook up 'Wet Nelly'.
- Pupils will visit Imperial War Museum, Manchester (for Remembrance) and hold a community litter pick (for World Kindness Day). We build our pupils' cultural capital through memorable and unforgettable experiences, trips and visits to special places of interest.


DREAM TEAM DAILY WINNERS!
