### This week's spotlight takes us to Year 4 and their festive forest school adventures...

This week, our pupils in Year 4 have been putting their foraging and nature-spotting skills to the test during their Forest School sessions. The children explored the school grounds, identifying different types of trees using their leaves, bark and shape. With their new knowledge - and plenty of teamwork - they collected natural materials to create their own beautiful willow wreaths. The finished wreaths are a wonderful celebration of the children's creativity and their growing confidence outdoors. We're so proud of their curiosity, care for nature, and willingness to get stuck in. Well done, everyone!

#### Wake Up Wednesday - What Parents Need to Know about AI-enabled Scams

AI isn't just transforming the way we learn and work, it's also reshaping the tactics scammers use online. From generating convincing phishing emails to fabricating influencer videos, criminals are using AI to make their scams more convincing than ever. Young people, who often embrace new tech quickly, can be especially vulnerable. This guide highlights several AI-enabled dangers – including romance scams, deepfake audio and video impersonations, and fake job offers – and explains how to spot and report them. With clear tips for verifying content, thinking critically, and using trusted platforms, it's essential reading for parents and educators to help young people stay one step ahead of the scammers.

#### **Online Safety Newsletter - December 2025**

As we head into the festive season, here's a quick online safety reminder for our parents/carers for keeping your child safe online. With new games, gadgets or devices likely to arrive over Christmas, please remember to check age-ratings (e.g. PEGI) and enable parental controls - especially if games allow chatting or in-app purchases. This December Online Safety Newsletter edition highlights the growing number of AI chat apps and online platforms: many of which are rated 13+ or even 18+, and pose risks around privacy, misinformation, or inappropriate content. The key message throughout the newsletter is, most importantly, talk with your child about what they use online and encourage open conversations, so they feel comfortable coming to you if anything worries them or goes wrong!

#### **Understanding Ofsted report cards and grade**

You may have read in the news about Ofsted's new inspection approaches and how they report the findings of education inspections. Ofsted have designed their new-look report cards with parents and carers in mind, to give you a clearer picture of what's working well in schools and where the next steps for improvement are. 
